A vase light an oscillating light is made to look like a lighthouse on a little island. It's surrounded by a little assortment of dinner. There's a teeter totter set up below/beside it with two ostrich lights on it. One is trying to push the other up to the other side to reach the dinners but it's hesitating. It's head is up just high enough to see there's a giant wave heading for the island and the ostrich is waving goodbye to the viewer.
Possibly one ostrich and two dinners on either end of teeter totter and he's standing on island hesitating to grab one as wave comes. Maybe use hay stack for hesitate

Graphics
This picture should look pretty happy but make sure to exaggerate the expression on the Ant's face as he should be the focus of the picture. Those are someone's hands in the water because he jumped off the roof and it didn't work, so make sure to put action lines around his hands like he's waving. Use clear looking vaseline on top of the coffee latte cup on the right and that's the same as in the ostrich's hand. The Teeter Totter should look like a child's Teeter Totter so use primary colors. Ostrich should be black or dark feathers with lighter facial and neck features. The Dinner on the top is just an assortment of food so color accordingly. Have Fun!
