

## Easy to Understand

### Topic Definition

It's a classroom setting. On the board in front of classroom, Art-latte is finishing a picture he's painted. It's a picture that shows Lucy plus Pie equals Pie-Lucy. The student is lamp-pig. He's being taught by eloquent elephant, who has a foot on his back and is gesturing toward the board. His other tutor is crow-gent, who is holding up an evidence bag with an empty pie tin in it. Lamp-pig gets it and his lamp is lighting up overhead and he's hitting an easy button.

### Graphics

Can this one we think should be fairly easy for you. I'm thinking the way you layer things should be ok, but I was thinking 3 layer groups: The Lucy pie board, The art latte/ crow gentleman with evidence bag, and The elephant/ lamp pig. The more layer groups, however, the better for me. A couple things to color specifically though is that Lucy has red hair and the thing in the evidence bag is a pie tin, so the bag should be transparent. One thing to keep in mind is that this one takes place in a classroom so if you want to put the setting indoors, keep it **subtle**. Let us know through email if you have questions!

### Dry audio

In this scene is a list of synonyms for easy to understand.

**Eloquent**; elephant; adjective; fluent or persuasive in speaking or writing. Also clearly expressing or indicating something.

**Limpid**; the lamp pig; adjective; free of anything that darkens, completely clear.

**Cogent**; crow-gent (gentleman crow); adjective; of an argument or case clear, logical, and convincing.

**Evident**; evidence bag; adjective; plain or obvious, clearly seen or understood.

**Articulate**; artist latte; adjective; of a person or a person's words having or showing the ability to speak fluently or coherently. Articulate can also be used as a verb; meaning expressing an idea of feeling fluently and coherently.

**Lucid**; Lucy; adjective; expressed clearly, easy to understand, a clear and lucid style.

**Pellucid**; pie-lucy; adjective; translucently clear or lucid in style or meaning.

### CREATIVE AUDIO

If you ask this **elephant** about the secret to being a good teacher, you'll be made a true believer by his eloquent reply. Elephants never forget because they learn to utilize visual aids from a very young age. His secret lies within his motives, because he can't imagine anything more fulfilling than imparting this technique upon his **lamp pig** student. Simply observe and it's **easy to understand** just how this student has been empowered with an **easy button** for learning. This courteous **crow gent** has a problem. Ever since his new neighbor moved in, his pies have been disappearing. Note exhibit A, clearly showing his pie tin as empty within the **evidence bag**. With a little help from this **artist latte**, the answer is clearly expressed through visual arithmetic. His neighbor **Lucy**, plus his pie, equals **pie Lucy**. Case closed.

1. Translucently clear
2. Lucid in style or meaning; easily understood
