Topic Defenition

scene one: Death is raking dead mice with tongues hanging out and X's over eyes. There's a kneeling bell beside them with it's hands in the air like he's screaming 'WHY!' A macaw has one of the dead mice off to the side and he's doing the ABRA CADAVAR trick with it and saying ABRA CADAVAR. This dead mouse is on a mirror bed with mirror at ends to prevent anything gory. A mournful bear is putting a wreath onto this dead mouse.

scene two: Death is raking a dead-skunk. Sheep troll is plugging nose and squeezing a lemon onto it. The lemon is lamenting with arms to the sky. Obi-sequins is sprinkling sequins on it. Ali-G is crying and blowing nose into dollar, possibly with George crying on the bill as well.

Graphics

Put special attention on the morning sun rising in the background. The death is giving an Elegy so green algae is coming out of his mouth while he's speaking onto a piece of paper. Notice that the dead bear is in a coffin and the lid is open. On the dead bear there is a Christmas wreath so make the leaves green and the ribbon red. The troll is going to be stone with the sceptor being gold with jewels on the end of it. The O and the B are on the end of snow skis. The lemon is crying onto dollar bills.

Instructional audio

In this scene are synonyms for death when related to mourning.

Dolorous; dollars; adjective; feeling or expressing great sorrow or distress.

Lament; lemon mint; noun; a passionate expression of grief. Lament can also be used as a verb meaning mourning of a person's loss or death.

Knell; kneeling bell; noun; the sound of a bell when rung solemnly for a death or funeral.

Elegy; algae; noun; a poem of serious reflection typically a lament for the dead.

Obsequies; O B skis; noun; funeral rites.

Bereave; bear wreath; verb; be deprived of a loved one through a profound absence.

Sepulchral; scepter troll; adjective; relating to a tomb or interment. Sepulchral can also mean a gloomy, dismal speech
